The Black-crowned night (Nycticorax nycticorax)



The black-crowned night heron, Nycticorax nycticorax, is a mediumsized waterbird that can be found almost throughout the world away from Australasia and the coldest areas. Young birds and adults look different from each other. Adults (one is shown here) are pale grey and white, with a black crown, black back and red eyes, as well as a silvery bill. Juveniles or young birds are brown, flecked and mottled with white and grey and with half of their bill yellowy-coloured. Night herons stand still at the water's edge and surprise their prey. They mainly hunt at night or in the early morning, but will also hunt during the daytime. They eat small fish, crustaceans, frogs and aquatic insects. During the day, night herons rest in specific trees and bushes overlooking water. In the evening, the herons disperse out into other wetlands and come back in the morning. In the north of the night heron's range, it is migratory, but it is resident in other places. It breeds in wetlands and nests in colonies. The nests are platforms of sticks that are put either in a group of trees, or on the ground in a concealed location. The scientific name means 'night raven', referring to this bird's nocturnal habits and its harsh, crow-like call. They usually can be seen resting in trees at Thalangama Tank in the early morning, or, alternatively, wild juvenile and adult birds can be seen in trees overhanging the wetlands at Dehiwala Zoo.
